“Police Promotions”



Five people have recently been promoted to various positions in the City of Norfolk Police Division.

Michael Bauer began his career with the Police Division 22 years ago as a patrol officer. He then worked as a detective in the Investigations Unit until becoming a corporal in 1997. In 2001 he was promoted to sergeant and served as supervisor of the Investigations Unit. In late 2012 he was promoted to captain and currently commands the Support Services Bureau. Bauer is originally from Creighton, Nebraska and holds an Associate of Arts degree from

Northeast Community College.

Dave Bos has been with the Police Division for 18 years. He is a native of Alvord, Iowa and served in the U.S. Air Force for four years before working as a patrol officer in Norfolk. He became an investigator before serving as a patrol sergeant. He was recently promoted to detective sergeant and supervises the Investigations Unit.

Tammy Mancini is the new dispatch supervisor for the City of Norfolk. She has worked in the Police Division's 911 Center for 11 years as a dispatcher and is originally from Norfolk. She has a degree from Northeast Community College in broadcasting and legal secretarial work.

Richard Frank has been promoted to corporal in the Police Division. He has worked for the Division for nine years as a patrol officer. He is originally from Norfolk and has served in the National Guard for 12 years.

Chad Reiman grew up in Armour, South Dakota and was in the National Guard for nine years. He attended Northern State University in Aberdeen, South Dakota where he obtained a Bachelor of Science degree in criminal justice and sociology. He was hired as a patrol officer for the Police Division in 1997 and was a corporal for five years before being recently promoted to patrol sergeant.

There are currently 38 sworn personnel authorized in the Police Division.

They consist of one chief, two captains, four patrol sergeants, one detective sergeant, four corporals, five detectives, one school resource officer and twenty police officers. There are 17 non-sworn personnel in the Police Division. They consist of one dispatch supervisor, eleven dispatchers, one records supervisor, one records clerk, one administrative secretary, one community service officer and one property officer.
