“Dale Coy Steps Down as City Council Member”

When Dale Coy saw an ad in the paper that there was an opening in the City of Norfolk Parks Division, he knew he wanted to apply for the position although it would mean stepping down as a member of the Norfolk City Council.

“In my involvement in the City as a council member I’ve seen how the staff works together as a team to get things done efficiently and for the best interests of the community. I’ve truly enjoyed making decisions for the City as a council member

and now I am anxious to contribute to the City from a hands on aspect,” Coy said.



Coy has represented the City’s Ward 1 since his election in November 2006. He graduated from Norfolk High and obtained an Associate’s Degree in Building Construction from Northeast Community College. After working at K-Mart and Gillette Dairy, he has been employed for almost 24 years at Veyance Technologies in Norfolk.

During Coy’s tenure as a council member, the Veteran’s Memorial Park improvement bond issue passed, LB840 funding was approved by voters, funds

were set aside for a natural gas pipeline, the City administration moved into the Supertel office building, and a new water transmission pipe was placed in southwest Norfolk.

The Mayor will be appointing a new member of the City Council to represent Ward 1 and fill Coy’s term that expires December 2014. Those interested in applying for the position should file a written statement of his or her intention to be considered along with a personal resume to Shane Weidner, Norfolk City Administrator at the City Administration Building 309 North 5th Street in Norfolk. Deadline for submitting these items to the City Administrator is June 23, 2014.
