On Tuesday, August 1st, neighborhoods throughout Norfolk are being invited to join with thousands of communities nationwide for the 34th Annual National Night Out crime and drug prevention event. This event will run from 6:00 until 8:00 p.m. at Central Park located at 705 South 6th Street in Norfolk. Sponsored by the National Association of Town Watch and co-sponsored by

the Norfolk Police Division, this event is free to the public and is designed to promote safe and crime free communities.

This event will allow you to meet representatives from Norfolk Police, Norfolk Fire, and the Nebraska State Patrol. They will be providing safety information and demonstrations throughout the evening. Area businesses have donated food and nearly 40 civic and service organizations will be showcasing what they have to offer in the community.

National Night Out is a national organization that involves over 35 million people in 16,000 communities from all 50 states, U.S. territories, Canadian cities, and military bases worldwide. It was organized to: (1) heighten crime prevention awareness; (2) generate support for, and participation in, local anti-crime programs; (3) strengthen neighborhood spirit and police-community partnerships; and (4) send a message to criminals letting them know that neighborhoods are organized and fighting back.
