The City of Norfolk held a successful auction after having to reschedule due to weather



After poor weather conditions called for cancellation of the Norfolk City Auction in June, partly cloudy skies allowed for an enjoyable outdoor auction on August 2nd.

Although this auction is usually filled with items from the Police Division, the library had much to add. Because the library is going through the renovation/expansion process, they had many tables, chairs, shelves, and furniture to add this year.

“This sale was critical to keep the library project on track,” said City of Norfolk Risk Manager, Lyle Lutt.

By selling the old furniture from a storage container in the parking lot, the library will now be able to move it off of the property so that area is ready for the next phase of construction. The storage container could not be moved if there were any items remaining inside.

There were 74 bid numbers issued with oak chairs and other seating items being the hottest on the market. There were four bikes from the Police Division that went for over \$20. Gary Bretschneider was the auctioneer for the event. The total proceeds of the event were \$1,869.50, with \$644 going to the public schools from the Police Division’s unclaimed stock.
