The City of Norfolk is searching for Norfolk residents who are passionate about improving appearances and instilling community pride to serve on the newly created Community Beautification Task Force.

The mission of the Community

Beautification Task Force is more than landscaping and streetscape enhancements, it's about community pride, youth retention, and economic growth.

Mayor Josh Moenning is looking for a group of 10-12 city residents to offer input on how the city will plan and prioritize its corridor beautification efforts. This work will be based on the findings and recommendations of the city's landscape master plan, approved by the City Council in 2009.

"This is about taking pride in our community, creating a sense of place, and promoting a welcoming and attractive city for our youth and for newcomers," said Mayor Moenning. "The established master landscape plan is well-detailed and comprehensive. Through a coordinated effort of citizens and city staff, I'd like for us to identify top priorities to correlate with what designated funding we have available in the next year."

Being a member of this task force does not require a long-term commitment. Members will meet on a semi-regular basis (not more than once a month) for the next year.
