City Auction to be Held on Wednesday, June 20

Are you in the market for a bike? Or maybe furniture for a DIY project? Then the City Auction is the place to be on Wednesday, June 20!

The City of Norfolk will be selling numerous items at auction to the highest bidder. There will be items from the remodel of the Library, unclaimed bikes and stolen property from the Norfolk Police Division, as well as items from other City divisions.

Some of the big ticket items this year include: Y2K generator, desks, upright freezer, file cabinets, computer stations, tires and rims, tools, toys, Wii games, a cooler, and more!

The auction will be held at 4:00 p.m. at 708 McKinley Avenue, Norfolk, Nebraska (across from the Ta-Ha-Zouka Softball Complex). Norfolk auctioneer, Gary Bretschneider, will be auctioning off the wide variety of items.

If you plan on purchasing some of the bigger items, please make sure you bring an adequate vehicle to haul them. Once the auction is over, you will have one hour to load your purchases. Items must be paid for by cash or check the day of the sale. Inspection of the items will begin at 3:00 p.m.

Last year 74 bid numbers were issued and the total proceeds of the event came to \$1,869.50. Although the money from items put on the auction from other City divisions goes to the City's general budget, any money from items sold by the Police Division, by Nebraska State Statute, goes to the Norfolk Public Schools system.
