On 4/8/17 at 6:56 a.m., Norfolk Police were dispatched to Menards (2311 Taylor Ave.) regarding a shoplifting in progress. Store employees reported that the suspect left Menards on foot and was running eastbound from the business. The suspect had stolen a surveillance camera, memory card and multi-tool. They provided a description of the suspect. Responding officers observed the suspect running eastbound near business in the 2100 block of Market Lane. Officer confronted the suspect in the 2200 block of Market Lane and took him into custody. He was identified as Cameron T. Goldman, 23, of Norfolk. Officers back-tracked his route and recovered the stolen Menards property. Officers also met with store employees and viewed surveillance video showing the theft. Goldman was arrested for shoplifting, obstructing a police officer and possession of stolen property. He was housed in the Norfolk City Jail and later released on cash bond.

On 4/9/17 at 12:06 a.m., Norfolk Police officers were dispatched to Hy-Vee East at 120 E. Norfolk Ave for a suspicious person. The male suspect was stated to have a bottle of vodka and was causing a scene inside the store. When officers arrived on-scene, they had contact with the male who was eating out of a box of Wheat Thins inside the store. He was identified as Dagan E. Dyson, 30, of Norfolk. Officers were informed that Dyson had not paid for the food that he was eating. Officers tried to convince Dyson to pay for the merchandise and leave the store. Dyson was argumentative with officers and refused to pay for the Wheat Thins and leave the store. He became irate and confrontational with the officers. At that point, officers placed him under arrest for shoplifting and obstruction of a police officer. A subsequent search showed that he had no money on him to pay for the food he consumed. Dyson was housed in the Norfolk City Jail and later transferred to the Madison County Jail.
